MUSIC NOTE WITH MS. TAYLOR

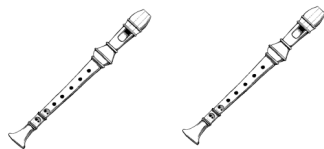
Springtime is a busy and exciting time for our music students! It brings concerts, festivals, and even a performance at a 51s game.

Our round of spring performances began on Saturday, March 17th with the 26th Annual CCSD Orff Festival. Eight of our students performed with 230 other elementary students in Ham Hall on the UNLV campus. 1,600 people watched students sing, dance, and play instruments to songs that centered around the festival theme of "water". Two Bozarth students, Caitleen Ramirez and Aiden Ramos, sang solos during the song, "The Water is Wide."

Students had a very full day beginning with a six hour dress rehearsal, a walk around the UNLV Campus, dinner, and then the performance. CCSD Superintendent Pat Skorkowsky attended the program and stopped by to congratulate our Bozarth students and have his picture taken with them! We'd also like to send a huge "thank you" to all of the families that attended the game. Our students had a great time and we were able to raise money for the Bozarth Music Program through ticket sales.

ART WITH MS. HOTCHNER

In art, we have been working on celebrating cultural heritage months, such as, China and Chinese New Year, as well as, Black History month with an emphasis on African culture and art work. Students were shown video clips and power points on these places, depicting the people, landscapes, city life versus village life and the art that represents each culture. For China, we made dragon puppets, Chinese lanterns, folding fans, Kokeshi dolls, bamboo brush painting and "dragonology" where students created their own type of dragon, then wrote a paragraph describing the story of their dragon. For Africa, we are making lion puppets, Masaai necklaces, Moroccan Khamsa hands, Kente cloth-paper weaving, Masaai warrior shields and African masks-collages. This week is clay week, where students will be creating 3-D objects that will be fired in the kiln and then painted with water colors. We will finish out the year with Hawaii for Pacific Island Heritage month. Students will be making tissue paper pineapples, Hawaiian paper dolls, painted tikis, sea turtles and surf board designs.
